

New Republican Attorneys General | Alaska, Florida, Missouri and Wyoming



Stephen Cox | Alaska Attorney General

- Stephen Cox was appointed Attorney General of Alaska in August 2025 by Governor Mike Dunleavy.
- He earned a Bachelor of Science from Texas A&M University and earned his Juris Doctor from the University of Houston Law Center. He is a member of the Alaska, Texas, and District of Columbia bar associations.
- AG Cox and his wife, Cristina, are raising their three children in Anchorage.
- As Alaska's AG is an appointed role, AG Cox is not eligible for election and is
 expected to serve through the end of Governor Dunleavy's administration in late 2026.



James Uthmeier | Florida Attorney General

- James Uthmeier was named as Florida's Attorney General by Governor Ron DeSantis in 2025 to fill the vacancy left when former AG Ashley Moody was appointed by the governor to the U.S. Senate.
- He received a Bachelor of Science from the University of Florida, where he ran varsity track and cross-country for the National Champion Gators, and earned his Juris Doctor from Georgetown Law.
- AG Uthmeier lives in Tallahassee with his wife, Jean, and their three children.
- He is eligible for election and has announced his candidacy for a full term in the 2026 election.



Catherine Hanaway | Missouri Attorney General

- Catherine Hanaway was appointed as Missouri's Attorney General in September 2025 to fill the vacancy created by the appointment of former AG Andrew Bailey to be the co-deputy director of the FBI.
- AG Hanaway holds a Bachelor of Arts from Creighton University and earned her Juris Doctor from The Catholic University of America Columbus School of Law.
- AG Hanaway resides in St. Louis with her husband, Chris, and their two children. They
 are active in several civil organizations.
- She is eligible to run in the 2028 election and has indicated plans to seek a full term.



Keith Kautz | Wyoming Attorney General

- Keith Kautz was appointed as Attorney General of Wyoming by Governor Mark Gordon in July 2025, filling the role vacated by former AG Bridget Hill when she joined the Wyoming Supreme Court.
- He earned his B.S. and J.D. from the University of Wyoming.
- AG Kautz and his wife, Karen, have three children and nine grandchildren.
- AG Kautz is not eligible for election, as the position is appointed in Wyoming. His term
 is expected to run through early 2027, coinciding with the end of Governor Gordon's
 current term.
